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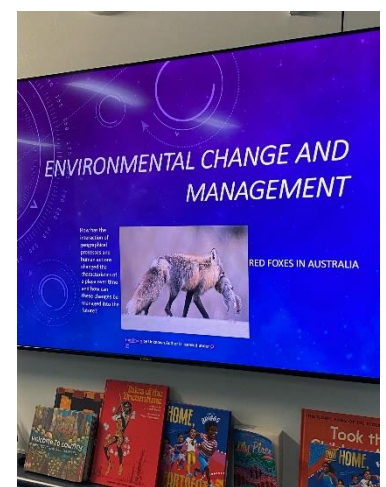
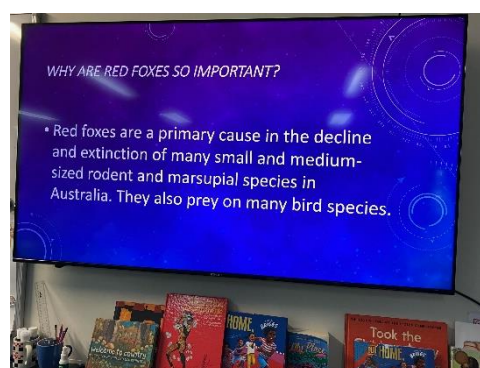
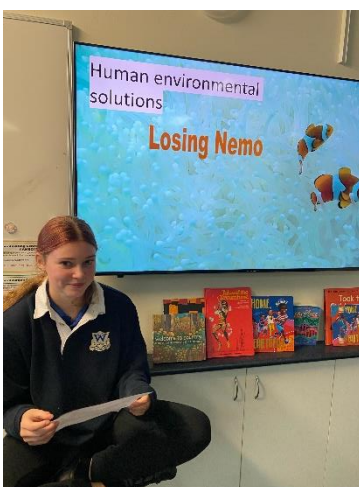
Japanese Matsuri

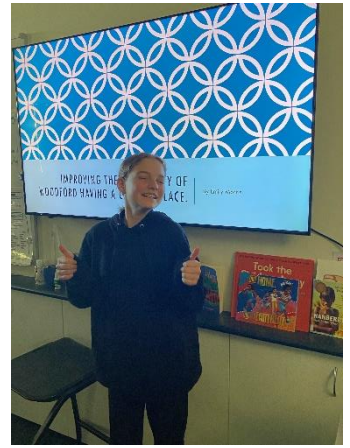
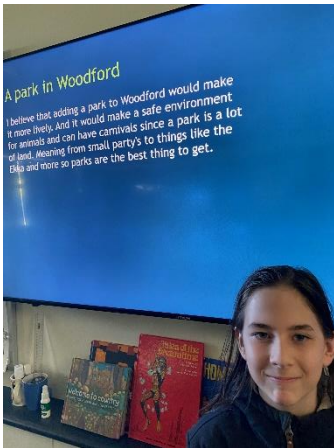
Year 10 Geography students impressed with their research work and proposed strategies for managing environmental change.

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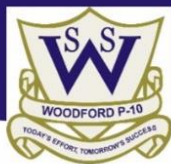

The Year 5 students went on an excursion to the Sir Thomas Brisbane Planetarium to learn about outer space and the different elements of our solar system.



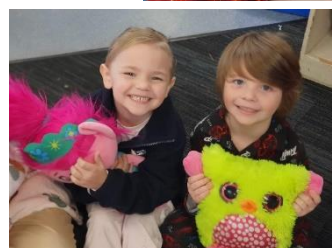
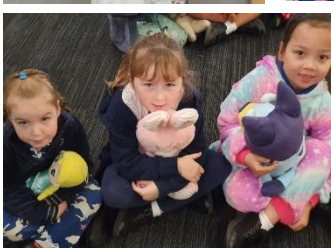
